Helen Byler is an American realist portrait and figure painter whose work, though sometimes miniature in scale, is expressive. She often adds still life and abstract elements to her oil paintings of people making references to life around them. In addition to showing nationally (and in Chelsea, New York and CT) she accepts commissioned work.

Helen is a faculty member in the Drawing & Painting department at Creative Arts Workshop. She holds a BA from Hampshire College and has studied at The New York Studio School, Yale University, and The Hartford Art School. Byler has had numerous solo and group exhibitions, and she is represented by the George Billis Gallery in New York and in Los Angeles.
